### From the Principal..

#### **Bushfire Season**

Going home this week will be an information page regarding this year's bushfire season which commenced for us last Tuesday. In practical terms, you will notice not much has changed for us regarding our procedures, with our *shelter in place* area still being the hall.

As per last season, if a catastrophic fire rating is issued our school will cease operations. This will likely occur on a very small number of days, if at all

The school will receive notification of these ratings the day before so it is very important contact details are up to date and the Skoolbag app has been downloaded.

#### **Road Safety**

During the past week the council's road safety officer has visited the school. During the visits she has looked at driver and pedestrian behaviour and has made a few recommendations that will occur throughout the year. As many would have noticed we have new orange pedestrian flags. These will be placed out on the crossing in the morning and afternoon each day. Hopefully this will help alert visitors to the area f the peak times when students are crossing the road. Signs and markings on the ground have also been earmarked for an update which will also help with pedestrian safety.

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.


#### 5/6E and Stage 3 Conquer the Tournament of Minds for 2020!



5/6E (and some other wonderful students from Stage 3), have spent the past 6 weeks working different solutions to a given problem. It culminated in the filming of 5 videos outlining the solution to a challenge. Tournament of Minds (TOM) is a problem-solving program for multi-aged teams of students who work together to solve a demanding, open-ended Long-Term Challenge. It has been a feature of schools for over 30 years. Wenty returned to the Tournament last year after a long absence and secured a first place in the Social Sciences division. This year it is a slightly different challenge due to Covid, so students had to film their responses. Fingers crossed for the results which will be found out on Sunday! #### Mr Evan's Maths Group

Mr Evans's Stage 3 Maths Group have been learning about fractals.

We learned about Sierpinski's triangle which was named after Polish mathematician Waclaw Sierpinski.


It's a fractal set based on an equilateral triangle, made by dividing the triangle into four smaller triangles, removing the central triangle then repeating this for the other triangles. If you repeat this forever you get a fractal.

In these photos we have made 81 Sierpinski triangles and combined them to make one large one.

We have also investigated the patterns within these triangles!

# SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES WHAT ARE YOU RISKING?

FACT

Children are small, harder to see, behave unpredictably and are extremely vulnerable. They need **YOU** to take extra care when driving and parking around school zones.



# No Parking

You have 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

PENALTY \$194 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS



# No Stopping

You are not permitted to stop on a length of road with a no stopping sign.

PENALTY \$349 +2 DEMERIT POINTS



#### **Bus Zone**

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus. \$349 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS



### Mobile Phone Use

Do not use a hand held mobile phone while driving.



# School Zone Speeding Offences

SCHOOL ZONE 8 - 9% 230- 4,7 SCHOOL DAYS 40kmph is the speed limit. Children are vulnerable in school zones.

# Pedestrian Crossings

Do not stop or park on or near a marked crossing.

PENALTY \$464 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

# **Driveways**

Do not stop on or across a driveway.

\$349 +2 DEMERIT POINTS

# **Intersections**

Do not stop on or within 20 metres of an intersection.

PENALTY \$464 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

# Parallel Parking

Must parallel park in direction of travel unless signpost states otherwise.

PENALTY \$349 +2 DEMERIT POINTS

# Double Parking

Do not double park in a school zone.

PENALTY \$349 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS

# Footpath and Nature Strip

Do not stop on a footpath, nature strip or obstruct ramp or path access. \$349 + 2 DEMERIT POINTS
