# Kindy Drinks, Jelly Cups & ice blocks - remind your child to collect from the canteen window

The first two terms of school, the canteen puts kindy drinks, jelly cups and ice blocks in the baskets with the lunch orders that go to the classroom as they are so new to the school.

From term 3 onwards we no longer put the drinks & jelly cups in the basket. Their lunch bag will be stamped with a drinks &/or jelly cup stamp & they come to the canteen to collect their drinks like the other children. Please remind your child to visit the canteen with their lunch bag to collect these items.

### **Quickcliq reminders**

- Place your order before 8.45am on the day of service. (If you miss this cut-off, it will place the order on the next day of service automatically)
- Please check for a confirmation email to confirm your order has been placed and check the date in the email is correct.
- If you have completed an order and want to add another item, you will need to cancel the existing order and place a whole new order for that day. The system only allows for one order per day. Unfortunately, if this isn't done, the new item will automatically be placed for the next day of service.
- If your child is sick or away and you have a Quickcliq order please call the school before <u>9.30am</u> the day of the order and we can arrange a refund minus the Quickcliq fee.
